1. OPENING

A. Roll Call

Mr. Wes Crain called the meeting to order. Mr. Walter Council stated there was a quorum.

2. OLD BUSINESS

A. 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP)

IMCAL and CSRS will meet with local government agencies regarding the MTP 2045, instead of one big meeting.

- Mr. Mike Huber suggested meeting with representatives from Chennault Airport.
 - Ms. Cheri Soileau mentioned meeting with freight, and that IMCAL will meet with North Lake Charles Redevelopment Alliance, again.

B. I-210 Bridge Project

Mr. Pat Landry stated that work will begin on January 7, 2019. It will impact traffic and placement on westbound of concrete barriers.

- City of Lake Charles will coordinate will LaDOTD to put out a media release.
 - It will be passed on to Tammy York.
- Mr. Wes Crain made an inquiry about C-Gov being able to obtain information.
 - o Mr. Crain asked about coordination with Louisiana State Police.
 - Mr. Landry said that there will be State Police Vehicles at both ends of the bridge.
- Mr. John Cardone inquired about any contact with casinos and Lake Area Industry Alliance.
 - Mr. Cardone asked that Tammy York contact casinos and Lake Area Industry Alliance before press release.
- Mr. Crain inquired about notices regarding I-10, before entering the state.
 - Mr. Landry said there will be digital billboards.

3. NEW BUSINESS

A. TIP FY 2019-22 Administrative Modification II

Mr. Council explained the administrative modification name change for the project #H.010865, from "I-210 W JCT I-10 – E JCT I-10" to the newer description, "I-210: Cove LN INTG – E JCT I-10".



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B. TIP FY 2019 - 22 Amendment V

Mr. Council requested TAC recommendation and TPC approval of Amendment V in TIP FY 2019 -22, which included LaDOTD's updated procedures to amend or administratively modify projects, as well as adoption of the following projects:

- Construction phase funding increase for H.009620 in FY 19; construction phase funding decrease for H.011838 in FY 19; and construction phase addition for H.013812 in FY 22.
- Mr. Cardone inquired about the changes in the administrative modifications. Ms.
 Dawn Sholmire explained administrative modification thresholds as the following:
 - Now projects over \$5 million, an administrative modification is limited to budget changes of less than 25% in funding. Previously, the threshold were projects over \$3 million, which changes less than 20% in funding.
 - Funding changes are now limited to 1,250,000 for projects phases (feasibility, environmental, right of way, utility relocation, engineering, construction) ≤
 \$5 million. Previously, funding changes were \$600,000 for project phases ≤
 \$3 million.
- Mr. Cardone motioned, seconded by Ms. Fontenot for TAC.
- Mayor Hunter motioned, seconded by Mayor Danahay for TPC.

C. TIP FY 2019 - 22 Amendment VI

Mr. Council requested TAC recommendation and TPC approval of Amendment VI, which included environmental phase funding change for H.009620 in FY 19.

- Mr. Landry motioned, seconded by Mr. Mary Fontenot for TAC.
- Mayor Danahay motioned, seconded by Mayor Hunter for TPC.

D. I-10 Bridge - Public Private Partnership Tollway

Mr. Patrick DeCorla Souza gave a presentation Public Private Partnerships, regarding the I-10 bridge as potential tollway.

- P3 allows private participation in delivery of projects.
 - Concessionaires are there if no money is in the budget.
 - Incentive to make sure roads are operating well.
- Different delivery options for Design, Bid, and Build to outright privatization.
 - Risk involve includes degree of ownership, development integrating, risk transfer, and extent of private financing.
 - Risk is shared between the public and private sectors.
- Benefits of P3
 - Able to transfer risks to all the private parties.
 - Improved cost and schedule control
 - Incentives to manage infrastructure
- Challenges
 - Need for legislation
 - Public perception



- o Public participation to pay user fees
- Lake of public sponsor, P3 Procurement, or an oversight of expertise
- Funding Sources
 - o Senior debts, loans, bonds, subsidies, and credit enhancements.
- Mr. Crain and Mr. Council asked about the Texas Route I-30, which went bankrupt for lack of motorist.
 - o Mr. Souza noted that it had been taken over by government entity.
- Mayor Hunter also asked about the impact of diversion on revenue
 - Depends on alternate route
 - o Costs
- Mayor Hunter asked may perhaps locals purchase toll credits at a lower price than non-locals and Mr. Souza said, "yes."
- Mayor Hunter asked what makes successful toll roads?
 - o Mr. Souza said just basic traffic freight movement should be up.
- Mr. Cardone asked about the need to have a free alternate route.
 - Mr. Souza said that on a federal level, "no". When it comes to the state level, they may have their own rules.
